# MINUTES OF THE NORTH BELLMORE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING May 2, 2017

The regular meeting of the North Bellmore Union Free School District Board of Education was held on Tuesday evening, May 2, 2017, in the All Purpose Room of the Martin Avenue School at 2616 Martin Avenue, Bellmore, New York.

#### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by President Nina Lanci at 6:41 PM and immediately adjourned into executive session. The meeting reconvened at 7:43 PM. Mr. Schissler led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Martin Avenue student, Kristina Trupo, read the district's mission statement.

#### **BUDGET HEARING**

Mr. Schissler reported that the 2017-18 budget is in excess of \$55 million and represents an increase of 2.94 percent. This year the proposed tax levy increase is 2.18 percent. This budget allows the district to continue all of our instructional programs as well as meet our contractual obligations. Our tax levy increase is by far the lowest of any of the component districts. Mr. Schissler added that the budget is good for the children and good for the community. He encouraged the community to vote on Tuesday, May 16 at Newbridge Road School from 6 a.m. – 9 p.m.

# APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education approve the Minutes from the Regular meeting of April 6, 2017 and the Special meetings of April 13, 2017 and April 20, 2017. Mr. Mayo seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

## SPECIAL PRESENTATION

On behalf of the Board of Education, Mrs. Cmar-Grote congratulated Mrs. Testa and Mrs. Lanci who were recently honored by the Bellmore Lions Club for their contributions to the community. Mrs. Cmar-Grote also recognized Ms. Canavan in observance of Administrative Professionals week.

## STEAM PRESENTATION

Mrs. Testa thanked Mr. Fischetti for the innovative and exemplary work they are accomplishing relative to attaining our goals for restructuring the work of the technology teachers. They have successfully moved us forward in the area of STEAM education and in the use of wireless devices - iPads. Mrs. Testa turned the presentation over to technology teacher, Mr. Michael Bevilacqua.

Mr. Bevilacqua gave an overview of the STEAM Technology Initiative (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) and explained how it promotes higher-level thinking, cross-curricular thinking, collaboration, problem solving, creativity, persistence and college and career readiness.

Mr. Bevilacqua and the following Martin Avenue third grade students in Ms. Kalinowski's class demonstrated how they use Ozobots to learn about robotics and coding: Eamon Andrews, Christina McLeneghan, Ellie Meyer and Quinn Sendrowitz. Mr. Bevilacqua invited the Board and administrators to experiment with the Ozobots.

Mr. Bevilacqua gave examples of other STEAM activities happening in North Bellmore schools. Students in fourth grade experiment with "Think" Cubelets to create a robot that completes a task. Students in fifth grade learn the process of making three-dimensional objects from a digital file using a 3D printer. At present, the district has two 3D printers at Gunther. Spheros, a robotic sphere that could be coded, are currently being piloted in sixth grade at Newbridge Road School. Mr. Bevilacqua added that Mrs. Squicciarini, Library Media Specialist, piloted "Makey "Makey" circuit boards at Park Avenue School last year. Mr. Bevilacqua thanked the Board of Education, the administrators and principals for all their support.

Ms. Squicciarini and Ms. D'Andrilli, music teacher, demonstrated how their students built guitars out of recycled materials and used "Makey Makey" circuit board kits to make their guitars "electric". The following sixth grade students played their guitars and invited Mrs. Testa and the Board to participate: Casey Backman, Cassidy Coveny, Casey McGovern, Christian Pongratz, Stella Proios, Georgios Margaronis, Peter Mayo, Kevin Perry, Owen Trenkle and Kristina Trupo.

Mr. Fischetti thanked everyone for the excellent presentation. Mrs. Testa thanked the entire faculty for enthusiastically welcoming the technology group and for embracing the STEAM initiative.

\*This appointment is subject to all applicable provisions of the NY Education Law including, without limitation, that, in order to be eligible for tenure, the referenced individual must have received annual composite or overall APPR ratings of Highly Effective (HE) or Effective (E) for at least three (3) of the four (4) preceding school years exclusive of any break in service. In addition, if the individual receives an ineffective (I) composite or overall APPR rating in his/her final year of probationary service, s/he shall not be eligible for tenure at that time even if she/he has secured HE or E APPR composite or overall ratings in every other year of his/her probationary service.

This expiration date is tentative and conditional only. In order to be granted tenure the teacher must receive composite or overall annual professional performance review ratings pursuant to Section 3012-c and/or 3012-d of the Education Law of either effective or highly effective to the extent required by the applicable provisions of the Education Law, the Rules of the Board of Regents and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, and if the teacher receives an ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year of the probationary period the teacher shall not be eligible for tenure at that time.
