TREASURER'S REPORT

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education approve the Treasurer's report for the month ended April 30, 2016. Mr. Ferrara seconded and the motion and was carried 5-0.

HIGH SCHOOL REPORT

Mrs. Lanci reported on last night's meeting. Among many presentations, the Board honored retiring members of the educational community, the Board President, and the Bellmore-Merrick PTAs. They recognized the 2016 Bellmore-Merrick Valedictorians and Salutatorians. The high school graduations will take place on June 26. Mrs. Lanci thanked the community for support the high school district budget, which passed by 73%.

FINANCE

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education approve the budgetary transfers dated June 2, 2016. Mrs. DeLauter seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mrs. Testa reviewed the academic and instructional goals that were set in 2013 to improve the way we were teaching and enhance student learning. Mrs. Testa and Mrs. Pollitt presented a Curriculum and Instruction status report highlighting the district's accomplishments from 2013 - 2016 in the areas of English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies. Some accomplishments include: Reading and Writing Workshop Model, Guided Math Module, Expanded Math Leadership, Integration of STEM units into our

Instructional Technology Curriculum, Implementation of ELA modules, selected district literacy consultant, Erica Pecorale, hired Curriculum & Instruction Coordinator and three Literacy Coaches, implemented updated report card, conducted Parent University Workshops, aligned Teacher Center courses with literacy initiatives, provided professional development to all staff to obtain a deeper understanding of the Common Core Learning Standards, purchased literacy based technology resources.

Mrs. Testa reported that she is working collaboratively with the principals, EIT and CSE teams to determine the number of class sections needed for next year. As the annual evaluations are not finished yet, we will continue to monitor the grade level enrollments on a daily basis before any final decisions are made to collapse or increase a class section. It's a fluid process and plans will flex and change as we learn more from the results of the annual reviews. We are currently looking at class sections at Martin, Newbridge and Park Avenue schools.

Certified Personnel: Upon recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, be it resolved that the following persons be appointed as teachers in North Bellmore Union Free School District as indicated below. All assignments are at the discretion of the district. Leave replacements are paid on a per diem basis.

*This appointment is subject to all applicable provisions of the NY Education Law including, without limitation, that, in order to be eligible for tenure, the referenced individual must have received annual composite or overall APPR ratings of Highly Effective (HE) or Effective (E) for at least three (3) of the four (4) preceding school years exclusive of any break in service. In addition, if the individual receives an ineffective (I) composite or overall APPR rating in his/her final year of probationary service, s/he shall not be eligible for tenure at that time even if she/he has secured HE or E APPR composite or overall ratings in every other year of his/her probationary service.

This expiration date is tentative and conditional only. In order to be granted tenure the teacher must receive composite or overall annual professional performance review ratings pursuant to Section 3012-c and/or 3012-d of the Education Law of either effective or highly effective to the extent required by the applicable provisions of the Education Law, the Rules of the Board of Regents and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, and if the teacher receives an ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year of the probationary period the teacher shall not be eligible for tenure at that time.

In addition, if the individual receives an ineffective (I) composite or overall APPR rating in his/her final year of probationary service, s/he shall not be eligible for tenure at that time even if she/he has secured HE or E APPR composite or overall ratings in every other year of his/her probationary service.

This expiration date is tentative and conditional only. In order to be granted tenure the teacher must receive composite or overall annual professional performance review ratings pursuant to Section 3012-c and/or 3012-d of the Education Law of either effective or highly effective to the extent required by the applicable provisions of the Education Law, the Rules of the Board of Regents and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, and if the teacher receives an ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year of the probationary period the teacher shall not be eligible for tenure at that time.

Mrs. DeLauter seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

SPECIAL EDCUATION

Ms. Eskew reported that annual reviews are still taking place. Once the CSEs are finalized, recommendations will be made for appropriate placements for the students. Mrs. Eskew explained that initially Expanded Resource Room classes were centered at Saw Mill Road School. Last year ERR classes were opened at Dinkelmeyer and Newbridge Road schools, which gave students from those schools an option to return to their home school. It is unavoidable for a student to go to a building other than their home school, unless ERR classes are opened in each school. If so, we would need to increase staffing in each school. If we could open another ERR class, we need to determine where to put it. We will know more once all the annual reviews are completed.

CPSE/CSE REPORTS

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education approve the CPSE and CSE reports dated May 25, 2016. Mrs. Cmar-Grote seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

BUSINESS DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Mr. Schissler reported that the North Bellmore budget also passed with a 73 percent passing rate and is a good compromise for what's good for children and the community. The budget reflects a very small increase of 0.82%. The tax levy increase is 0.43%. The new budget will provide for consultants, literacy coaches an updating of technology equipment.

We have contracted with JC Broderick, an environmental services consulting firm, to test for any levels of elevated lead concentrations in the water within the schools. The testing indicated that only 3 out of 134 water fountains in our five schools were identified as slightly exceeding the 20 ppb (parts per billion) EPA action level. EPA recommends that schools take action if samples from drinking water outlets show lead levels greater than 20 parts per billion. As a result of the

findings, we immediately complied with the recommendations of JC Broderick and shut down the fountains and removed the fountain heads. The new fountain heads are scheduled to be replaced shortly. After installation, the new units will be re-tested prior to being used. We will continue to partner with J.C. Broderick on an annual basis to conduct water testing.

Enrollment is remaining steady—staying the same.

We are in the process of finding a replacement for the Director of Food Services by July 1. As there is no eligible list from the Civil Service Commission available, we advertised for the position. Not many resumes have been received. We will be interviewing for the position tomorrow.

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

The Board asked when the State will implement the new Science Learning Standards. Mrs. Pollitt indicated that the standards are in draft form and that the Regents are scheduled to review the document at their next meeting, with a possible adoption in the fall. Similar to the new Social Studies Standards, there will be a slow implementation.

Mrs. DeLauter questioned how much information the district got from the NYSED reports and data that was just released on the ELA and Math assessments. Mrs. Pollitt indicated that Nassau BOCES has recently given us access to the State assessment data which has been the earliest we have ever received the information. She further explained that, due to so many test refusals, we have limited data.

Mr. Mayo commented that in his past year as president and being on the Board of Education for three years, Mrs. Testa, the administrative team, principals, teachers, staff, technology department and Mr. Russo have always acted in the best interest of the children—not quick decisions.

Mrs. Testa congratulated the new teachers that were approved this evening and welcomed them to the district: Tiffany Antonucci, Melissa Dwyer, Ashley Evans, Melissa Felson, Kristin Henchel and Alyssa D'Amato. Mrs. Testa thanked the Board of Education for approving the new appointments. She also thanked Ms. Eskew for the rigorous interview process. Mr. Mayo commented to the new teachers, "Do great!"

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Mr. Fischetti reported that outside of the designated Smart Schools Bond funds used for iPads, we are in the process of appropriating the remaining funds (\$700,00) as follows:

- Entirely new wireless infrastructure \$200,000
- Upgrade of all districtwide network switches \$50,000
- Thin client solution for all classrooms \$200.000
- Replace older SAN stores all district data \$100,000

- Replace all teacher smartboard computers with solid state drive machines \$75,000
- New extended batteries and solid state hard drives for laptops \$75,000

Mr. Fischetti advised that the ERate funding has been finalized. Vendors can begin work after July 1 – cabling and network drops districtwide, install all switches required for new wireless network and access points.

Mr. Fischetti reported that the Intralogic installation is complete. Tristate is coming next week to work with Intralogic directly next week. They will visit all buildings to correct issues related to the PA announcements.
