MINUTES OF THE NORTH BELLMORE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING May 12, 2015

The public hearing/regular meeting of the North Bellmore Union Free School District Board of Education was held on Tuesday evening, May 12, 2015, in the All Purpose Room of the Martin Avenue School at 2616 Martin Avenue, Bellmore, New York.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. Motion was made by Mrs. Lanci, seconded by Mr. Mayo, to move into executive session to discuss negotiations. Motion was carried 5-0. The meeting reconvened at 8:20 p.m. Mrs. Cramsie led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mrs. DeLauter then read the District's Mission Statement.

PUBLIC HEARING 2015-16 SCHOOL BUDGET

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education convene its public hearing on the 2015-16 school budget. Mrs. Lanci seconded and the motion was carried 5-0. Mr. Schissler advised that the budget to budget increase is 1.94 percent. The tax rate increase is 1.75 percent. This budget allows for the carryover of all educational programs, as well as adding more math and ELA support. There is also a plan to hire a Literacy Coach to work on guided reading. Mr. Schissler stated that the district has submitted a Tax Efficiency Plan to Albany. Once the Plan is accepted by the Division of Budget, every eligible homeowner will receive a rebate check next fall based on the actual increase to the homeowner's tax bill. Mr. Schissler advised that the budget vote will take place on May 19 from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. at Newbridge Road School.

MOTION TO RETURN TO THE AGENDA

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education return to the regular agenda. Mrs. DeLauter seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education approve the Minutes from the regular meeting of April 16, 2015. Mr. Ferrara seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education approve the Minutes from the special meeting of April 21, 2015. Mr. Mayo seconded and the motion was carried 3-0, with Mrs. Lanci and Mr. Ferrara abstaining.

VISITORS

There were no questions relating to agenda items only.

CORRESPONDENCE

Mrs. Cramsie advised that correspondence was received and will be reviewed by the Board.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education approve the Treasurer's report for the month ended March 31, 2015. Mr. Ferrara seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

HIGH SCHOOL REPORT

Mrs. DeLauter reported that at last week's Board meeting there was a public hearing on the 2015-16 budget. A presentation was given on math and science instructional initiatives which will target the fourth grade curriculum in elementary school. The plan will give most students the opportunity to opt in to the Honors track for math and science in eighth grade, if they wish. Mrs. Testa will be collaborating with the High School District on this plan. This will allow students to take advanced classes later in high school and help them be more college ready. A presentation was also given on the \$2.1 million NYS Smart Schools Plan which was approved.

FINANCE

The Board of Education acknowledged the review of the warrants that have been approved by the Internal Auditor.

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education approve the Budgetary Transfers dated May 12, 2015. Mr. Ferrara seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education approve the Staff Development Report dated May 12, 2015. Mr. Ferrara seconded and the motion was carried 5-0.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mrs. Testa thanked the Board for supporting the probationary teacher recommendations. She extended congratulations to Nicole Giusto, Nicole Martelli, Chrissy Meiselas, Stephanie Meehan, Diane Viccaro and Jenna West on their new appointments.

Mrs. Testa stated that our students will be joining the High School District in supporting their cause to bring the community together with a common goal of setting a Guinness World Record through their initiative, "Ties for Ties."

Mrs. Testa thanked Mr. Schissler and the Board of Education for presenting the budget to the North Bellmore Civic Association and thanked the Civic Association for their donation of gift cards for the sixth grade awards.

Mrs. Testa thanked Mr. Russo for assessing signage and ground markings around the schools to assure a safe arrival and dismissal environment.

Mrs. Testa stated that the administration is busy analyzing staffing needs for next year to ensure that all departments are staffed appropriately to meet the needs of the students.

Mrs. Testa highlighted activities taking place in each of the schools that support the district's mission and core values.

On behalf of the Board of Education, Mrs. Cramsie congratulated Mrs. Testa on being nominated by Senator Venditto and receiving the Women of Distinction award sponsored by the New York State Senate in recognition of her impact on education and contributions to the community. She added that Mrs. Testa was also recognized by the PTA Coordinating Council and received a Distinguished Service Award.

BUSINESS DEPARTMENT

Mr. Schissler reported that the Business Office is preparing for the budget vote. There has been no significant change in the May student enrollment. Mr. Fischetti is in the process of working on the \$1.2 million Smart School Bond which will be finalized in the next school year. Mr. Schissler stated that he and Mr. Russo are looking into the parking lot situation at Saw Mill again and will be making recommendations to the Board at the next meeting.

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

Mrs. Pollitt reported there will be an informational meeting for parents of incoming kindergarteners to give them an overview of the kindergarten program on the evening of the budget vote on May 19.

The ALPHA nomination packets are due on Friday. After that a letter will be sent to parents asking for consent to screen further. Screening will take place the first two weeks of June.

The performance part of the grade 4 science assessments will take place between May 20 and May 29. The written part will take place on June 1. Scoring will be done on June 2.

The APPR Committee met again yesterday and they have narrowed it down to three rubrics. We will be bringing back BOCES consultant, Michael Kenney, to focus on the last three choices. The next meeting will be at the end of May.

Two new ESL teachers have been added to the staff for next year. We are hoping to administer the NYSITELL initial screening assessment to potential kindergarten ELL students during the kindergarten screening. This will give us a better understanding of our projected kindergarten ESL caseload for next year and help us start services earlier in the fall.

HUMAN RESOURCES SPECIAL EDUCATION

Ms. Eskew reported that it is a very busy time of year in Human Resources and the Special Education departments. We are in the process of recruiting and interviewing for open positions. Ms. Eskew thanked the principals for their participation. Annual reviews and CSE meetings are taking place to plan for next year. Summer school planning has started. Ms. Eskew reported that she is working with Ms. DiChiara and Mr. Fischetti to perform assistive technology evaluations. It is a very labor intensive process.

Ms. Eskew stated that she has met with the nurses to determine the equipment needs for next year. In addition to purchasing insulated wheelie bags for medications, it was recommended that we purchase two wheelchairs to replace old, non-functional chairs.
