Initially, we had approximately 70 students who were scheduled to come to the program. Along the way, because many families are so stressed about COVID and making sure that their children are healthy and safe in school, we did lose approximately 16 students in the sense that parents opted not to send the children to the program but rather have opted for remote learning.

We've had mixed reviews on the remote learning for special education. There were many parents who were very satisfied with it. Some children even made progress getting

their services delivered remotely being out of
the whole classroom. It seemed to work for
them, and then there were students who did less
well.

In terms of the summer program, we will have seven classes, two of which will be eight, one, twos, meaning eight students, one special education teacher, and two paraprofessionals, and there will be five classes that will have twelve students in them.

Dr. Kaminska has been appointed as the lead teacher for the on-site issues at the -- not issues, but supervision of the summer school program. I have been appointed as the principal, and I will continue to function in that capacity.

Mrs. Kaminska and I, and the clerical staff in the Special Education Department, have been busy doing walk-throughs repeatedly through the summer school program to make sure that all of the protocols for health and safety are in place. There are signs on the walls. There are cones dividing the corridors to make sure that children, if they

7-2-20

are transitioning in the common areas, that they are separated from each other, and that they can visually see where six-feet markers are so that they can remain apart from each other. The only time during the summer school, in accordance with the guidance that's been provided, that children will even be making transitions will be when they are arriving and transitioning for dismissal. All of the other activities are going to be centrally self-contained. Instruction will take place in the classroom.

Speech/language services, which is one of the largest components of our program, is -- will all be pushed in to the classroom so that teachers will see one class at a time, then disinfect and wash their own hands, make sure that they're wearing a mask, and be able to transition to another class so that children are not commingled in service groups in order to allow them to remain as segregated from each other as possible.

Some parents have expressed concerns about how the children are going to

feel about this, that they're not able to come into contact with their peers in the classroom, and what is recess going to look like, and so forth, and they're concerned about the children being confined to the classroom all day and not having opportunities for physical movement and physical activity. I have spoken with a number of parents, sent out some information to them indicating that we do have some activities that are planned that will be provided at recess. We also have a physical education teacher who works with us in the summer who will be providing physical education by specific classes as a whole group. There are socially -- there are activities that can be done while maintaining social distance. Hopscotch, for example, you can play with hula-hoops. Then today, we had a guidance document come out -or maybe it was yesterday -- saying that we now are able to use the playground equipment, which previously we were not permitted to have the children utilize. So they put in the child's name, and they'll have the date, and they will do everything; answer the COVID questions in terms of exposure -they'll do everything except submit the document and enter the temperature for the child. When the child arrives at the school. the temperature will be taken by the screeners that we have assigned both at the bus stop in the main entrance and also at the Oak Court entrance. So everyone will be screened before they come into the building.

I've sent out documentation to the parents letting them know that if an adult or a child have a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, that they will not be given entry into the building, and that there is no disputing that decision. That day, they have to go home, and then we will follow up with them. The nurse will make phone calls to make sure about how they're doing in order to make sure that

people are not coming into the building who should not be there.

Let me just see. I told you guys that.

So the -- preceding all of the plans for the building was a lot of training. We had to do mandatory orientation training sessions with all the personnel that were coming to explain all of this, and there's a lot more than what I'm expressing right now, that goes into this safety and hygiene protocols. We wanted all of them -- I did all of the aides, all of the teachers. We did it all by Zoom, all of the training, and it explained everything to them about our health and safety procedures, and we took attendance, so we have documentation for the Department of Health, or anyone who should come in asking us for that information. We are required to prove that we have these procedures in place should we be asked to do so.

All of the personnel are also going to be required to take two brief trainings, which are provided on video, thanks to Janet

Pollitt's office, where they are going to see a video about the proper way to wear a mask and how to handle a reusable mask if that is your choice. And the second one is how to properly wash your hands. And so all of that is going to be required of everyone.

The bus drivers, our bus drivers, have been in yesterday morning, and they also received their Chapter 408 reviews, where we discussed the needs of the specific children who will be on their buses and to help them to understand what the needs of those children may be. We have indicated that wearing of masks is encouraged, but it is not required. This particular population may have sensory issues or other issues that preclude them from being able to tolerate the masks, and so we wanted to make sure that everyone was on the same page about understanding that so that we don't have any behavioral issues that arise when children resist doing that.
